can make change.

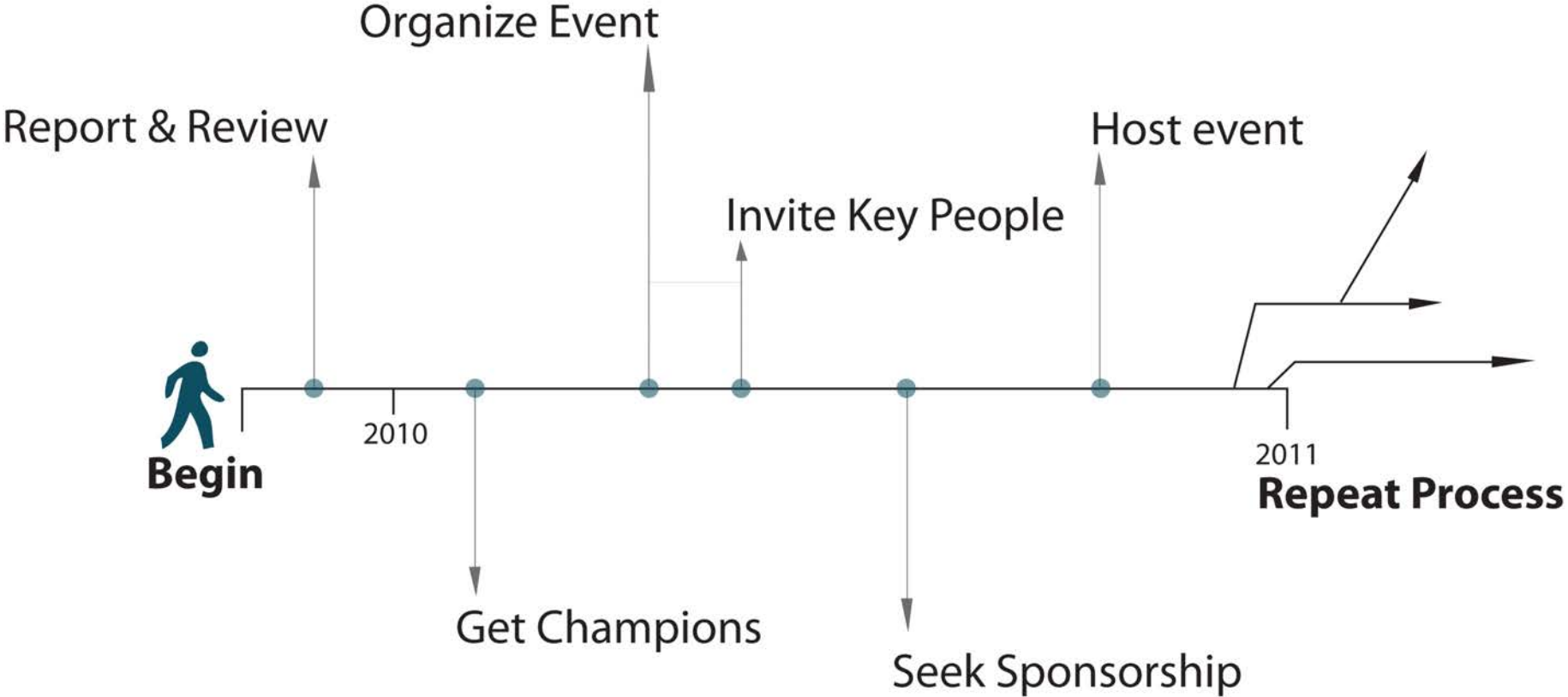
TAKE MY SEAT
